8* MOTION: (Hon. Wilfred Monyenye, Chairperson, Health)

That The Kisii Teaching and Referral Hospital Bill, 2013 be now read a second time.

9* MOTION: (Hon. Samson Matoke Nyagaka, Chairperson, Delegated Legislation)

That the Kisii County Flag, Emblem and Names, 2013 be now read a first time.

10*MOTION: (Hon. Samson Matoke Nyagaka, Chairperson, Delegated Legislation)

11* Motion (Hon. PHELISTER OCHAKO METOBO)

Aware that article one of the constitution reaffirms the sovereignty of the people of Kenya, Mr Speaker; women form the majority of Kenyans. Therefore, I move the following motion that seeks to form the committee on Gender to cater for special interests of women in order to meet the constitutional threshold in liaison committee.

Aware that livestock trading is a major revenue earner to this County and that the livestock traders make their income from the buying and selling of livestock; I this house urges the ECM in charge of Agriculture sector to give a comprehensive report as to why a quarantine imposed in December 2013 has not been lifted. I urge this house to pass a motion that this quarantine be lifted within one week.
